On the occasions of World Environment Day and Buddha Jayanti, students actively participated in a rally organized around the Boudhanath Stupa. The rally helped raise public awareness while encouraging students to connect classroom learning with real-life social responsibility and community engagement.



Tour Week (23rd Nov to 5th Dec)

Recognizing the importance of experiential learning, KBS organized Tour Week for all grades, extending beyond the traditional Class X tours. Students from Nursery to Class IX participated in age-appropriate educational and recreational visits.

Class X students undertook a three-day educational tour to Pokhara and Lumbini, gaining exposure to natural beauty, cultural heritage, and historical significance. Field study observations were later compiled into portfolio files, reinforcing learning through reflection and documentation.




SEE Examination Results

- A Grade: 36 students




Motivational Session for Students

Introduced Portfolio

This year, we introduced a portfolio system as part of the evaluation process for students from Grades 1 to 10.
